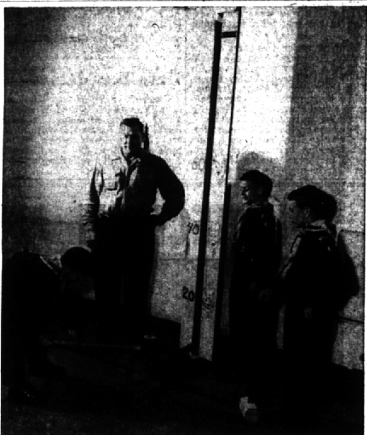

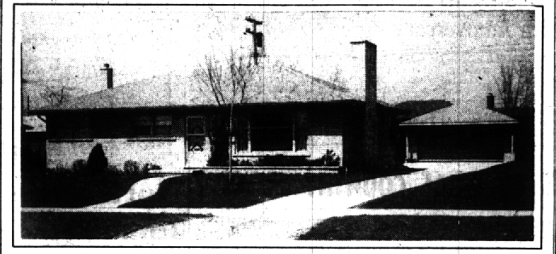
Walnut Lake Man Loses Marbles, Buys 'em Back!

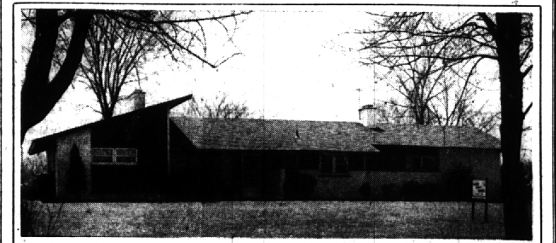
Youth Guidance Program Planned In Southfield
