A highlight of the fair will be the puppet show, "The Three Little Pigs" done by the Birmingham A.A.U.V. There will be three showings.

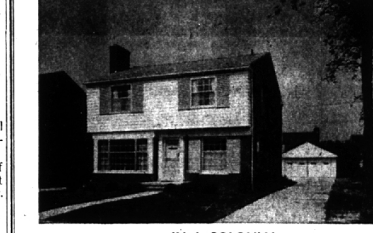
Also on the mid-way will be the traditional T-shirt sale and the Cake Walk.
