

Cranbrook Residents Give Views on Stream Control

CRANBROOK VILLAGE — Residents of Cranbrook Village were given an opportunity last week to express their views on the future of the small stream that runs through the heart of their subdivision.

THE DRAIN commissioner's plan, said Henny at a meeting held last week at Northbrook school, was for a 25-foot while ditch ap-proximately six feet deep through the village.

the village.

The present stream has dam, and waterfalls, Henny continued, with a certain natural beauty. Homes costing \$18,000 to \$35,000, he said, would depreciate greatly if the project was constructed as proposed by the county.

HENNY TOLD THE 125 assembled residents-that an underground pipe installation for the developed area would cost about \$100,000. The bascule gate and revised dam

is estimated to cost \$30,000 or about \$10 per home if equally dis-tributed over the entire drainage district. The county proposal cost is set about \$183,000 or \$60 per home.

BASED ON A calculated flow of 450 cubic feet per second, which is the amount of flow created by a five year storm, the committee found that the dams now in the stream could not stay as they are present.

CRANBROOK VILLAGE residents are primarily interested in flood prevention, a constant and resonable water level in dry weather, and preserving the natural beauty of their stream, Henny said.
