She was 1952's "Woman of the Year in Education," and "Woman of the year in 1956."

Summer school classes are being offered this year at Birmingham high school, 2436 W. Lincoln, it was announced today. Classes, open both to residents and non-residents, will be given for ninth to 12th graders. Said counselor Don Golliver, "Classes are scheduled daily, 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., June 22 through Aug. 14. Students, Golliver said, may take one-half or one-credit courses—the maximum.

REGISTRATIONS run from May 25 to June 19, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., in room A-108 at the high school. Late registrations will be taken June 22, 23 and 24. Courses include: Algebra I and II, general math (ninth grade) and plane geometry, English I and III (ninth and 11th grades), French and Spanish I. Sciences: biology, chemistry and general science (ninth). Social studies: civics, sociology, U. S. and world history. Speech and typing are also being offered.

Friends, Courage Ease Eight-Year-Old's Trial

When a fellow's luck is running low, some of the things he needs most in the world are a gang of friends, grandstand support and real, tight-lipped courage.

Eight-year-old Brian Schultz, 570 Bird, learned during the last few weeks just how valuable these things can be, and how helpful friends are—even when they're "pirates."

Brian was released last week from William Beaumont hospital; a heavy gauze bandage still covers his right eye. The quiet Pierce school third-grader was cutting open a dog food box, when the knife slipped and cut his eye. It was Brian's responsibility to take care of the Schultz' boxer, "Koro."

Doctors have removed the lens, but don't know the final extent of the damage. Brian's friends started to tangle them. Seven "pirates" and a brother and sister "islands" (Smith Street is one block north of Bird) enquired a letter telling their "mates" how they had "raided private ships on Bird Island."

THEIR MAY 4 "raid" netted "booty" amounting to \$32. The children sent the money and a bag of "silver" (tin-foil wrapped candy) to be used in "ribbing the patient" to let him out, since his friends were not allowed to visit the patient.

Brian, "a quiet boy," is taking the accident better than his parents, the father said. The boy's father, Orion Schultz, is physical education instructor at Birmingham high school. "Brian is getting restless," the father said. "Ever try to get an eight year old to sit still? Well, he's been on his back for about three weeks."

A "B" STUDENT, Brian likes sport. He's been sleeping with one of two baseball bats he just received. He had just signed up for tee-ball—a Little League team.

ANOTHER FAN—a three-year-old girl down the block—sent him her most precious treasure—a teddy bear. Cards have been coming in from his Pierce school classmates and members of the First Methodist Sunday school. Brian, however, has been taking it all with the quiet courage of a champion. "It's almost a fault," his father said. "When he wanted or needed something, he won't ring for a nurse; doesn't want to bother them."

"He's been that way all his life—almost eight years."
