People are wonderful. Whenever we begin to lose sight of that truth, along comes something which reminds us in a hurry. This time it was one of the most delightful letters we've ever read, written by Birminghamite Mrs. Charles H. Huntoon.

You may recall a story in the April 16 edition of The Birmingham Eccentric reporting the April 2 automobile accident which injured Mr. and Mrs. Huntoon, their daughter, Carolyn 21, and young son, Christopher, 7, near Savannah, Ga.

Herewith, Gene Huntoon's letter written April 17 from the Memorial hospital of Chatham county, Savannah:

"DEAR FRIENDS AND FAMILY:

Will you please be kind enough to accept this form letter as a heartfelt expression of our gratitude to all of you wonderful people who are helping us over this rough time? We'd prefer to write individual letters, but just can't do it—there are so many of you! You have warmed our hearts with your letters, cards, jokes, calls, flowers, prayers, presents, phone calls, and especially the loving care of our daughter at home. We have always known that our relatives and friends were "the most" but now Chatham county of Georgia knows it, too! As soon as we can find some money, we are going to buy telephone stock—believe me, Michigan Bell never had it so good! Our northern friends use the phone like an inter-com!

"THIS ALL started like something out of Kipling: North is north, and south is south, And never the twain did meet 'Till Thursday afternoon, April Second When I was in the driver's seat! "It was pouring so hard in Florida that Thursday morning that Charlie had to carry our luggage out to the car, drive to a gas station with a shelter and pack the trunk there. After two trips, he'd had it and we piled the rest inside the car with us. Since we had tried unsuccessfully to get reservations in Charleston, we left early so we'd reach there by afternoon and snag a motel. As it turned out, we needn't have worried. This motel has maid service, innerspring mattresses, double-jointed beds, air-conditioning and a restaurant on the premises. (No swimming pool, not AAA.)

"JUST PICTURE the four of us (Ginni happily safe on her Senior Class Washington trip) breezing along in the T-Bird—calm—peaceful—no worries. There were intermittent showers and rain and I kept on my parking lights as extra precaution; but as we reached Georgia, the weather cleared. Speed traps, traffic and two-lane highways made it difficult to make very good time. We ate our lunch as we drove along and about 1 p.m. Carolyn and Chris were resting in the back seat and Charlie was starting to doze in the front seat beside me. Still calm and peaceful!

"THEN!!! A grey '56 Olds suddenly left his southbound lane and made a beeline diagonally across the white line toward us. I couldn't believe my eyes! I didn't even have time to sing three notes of "Dixie" before north met south. The first impact actually wasn't so bad, but then we spun around in the air and the crash as we landed was a regular DeMille production!

"In a matter of minutes, a friendly face at the window was saying, 'Don't you worry, ma'am, we'll get you out of there real soon.' And by pulling apart the seats, ripping off the top and doing plain dirty work, they did just that.

"OUR APRIL 2nd 'Open House' wasn't exactly the usual kind. Conscious and unconscious, the four Huntoons 'received' as we lay on luggage, bags of oranges and piles of beach towels at the side of the open road! The welcome wail of ambulances sounded before too long and to the clicking of TV cameras, we were loaded onto stretchers. Mine was at the top of our ambulance with Chris out of sight behind me, and I must admit that I enjoyed the ride with nothing but a pane of glass between me and the flying countryside as we zoomed the 13 miles to Savannah.

"TWO DOCTORS on their 'afternoon off' plus assorted interns, nurses and aides spent four hours patching up Charlie and the rest of us and I am sure that we had the best attention possible. (Charlie is complaining that he had to pay for an anesthetic when he was unconscious anyway!) For sever-
