Of course, he has to be fed and after one demonstration of my feeding technique, he makes sure that one of his nurses is on hand at mealtime. The fact that I was standing on one leg, reaching food from a tray in the middle of the room, over and between his ropes, may have influenced his decision.

"The rest of us were pretty lucky. Carolyn, with two fractured lumbar vertebrae, is counting the weeks until she can lose her new 30 inch waistline of the body cast.

"As you may have heard, Chris has saved his 150 stitches in a bottle. By charging a small fee for a look, we may be able to pay for a few of them! Among his many gifts were some plastic bugs which appear with nauseating frequency in our water carafes.

"YOURS TRULY is fine except for a few gouges, a purple, green and yellow chest, and a bum knee which is in a cast from toes to hip. No one remembered to tell me how to use crutches and one day I fell flat in front of the nurses' station. They all came scuttling out like little white hens.

"We all have nurses, par excellence, and they and our doctors have done everything so that our family could be together in this wonderful hospital, an important factor in our rapid recovery.

"We know now that 'southern hospitality' and 'milk of human kindness' are not just trite phrases. We have a Savannah 'angel' who has done everything heavenly for us and has brought around other angels, Savannahian callers, night and day, have come bearing flowers, gifts and offers of every kind of assistance. We love our new friends!

"CHRIS WANTED to know 'why God made us have the crash.' I haven't figured out the answer to that, yet, but if our family can pass on to others even a small part of what has been done for us—maybe there'll be the beginning of an answer.

"Lest we bog down in sentiment, let me repeat the substance of one of our cards: 'The most painful thing about your accident will be hearing about it.'

"Thanks again to all you wonderful people! Happy motoring! We'll be seeing you!
