

Seton Guild Plans June Benefit Tea

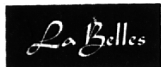

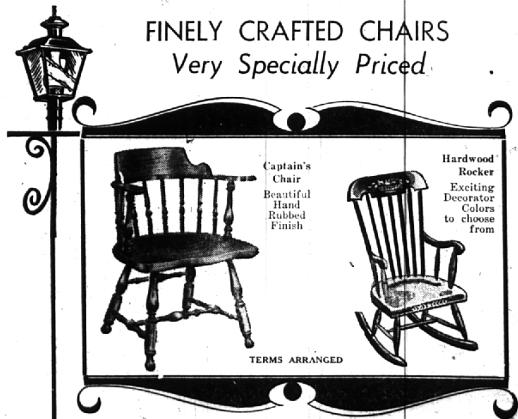

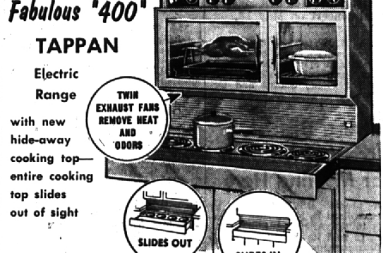
