RUT HIF's replacement, this Anderson youngster who is only 23 years old, is liable to cause a disturbance on the local track scene if background is any indication of his future.

Oddly enough, that background is similar to both track coaches at Birmingham and Cranbrook schools.

Kermit Ambrose, who has a nasty habit of winning track titles with monotonous regularity at Birmingham, and his fierce competitor over at Cranbrook, Ben Snyder, who has acquired that same habit over the years, are both well-educated men who love sports in general and track in particular.

This word mechanic is the first to admit that Country Day does not compare in size to either Birmingham or Cranbrook, but those little schools have a way of becoming big schools.

AND NOW this Anderson fellow is going to coach at that little school that has only a few students on the track team each spring.

Anderson, who will graduate from the University of Detroit next month, was an all-city football and track athlete at Redford high in Detroit and participated in no less than 10 events while attending U. of D.

Anderson ran both hurdles, is co-holder of the pole vault record, works the shot put and then throws the discus and javelin. In between these events, he runs the 100-yard dash, participates in the high and broad jump events and then takes a breather by running a leg on the mile relay team.

In his spare time, he was an assistant coach to Halling at Country Day and somehow found time to get married and have an 18-month-old son in the process.

JUST BY glancing at his background, you soon realize that he's smart, talented, healthy and a hard worker.

Since Birmingham rules the Class A track picture and Cranbrook the Class B division, wouldn't it be something if DCD became a power in the Class D division?

With this Anderson now at DCD, that is a distinct possibility.
