"There are already established agencies and organizations in this area which are trying to meet the needs of the people of this community. But there are two problems."

"People don't know what services exist to help them or how to get help and, because the many agencies have had no overall organization or guidance, many services have been duplicated and, at the same time, many needs unmet."

"THE COUNCIL on Community Services is a new organization in which all health and welfare groups, both public and private, are invited to participate under leadership, to channel the work which they do and the services which they provide."

"Let me give you an example," smiled the tall, soft-spoken man. "Here are a few things one community council did in a recent year."

"IT STUDIED and approved a plan to establish a community center."

"It worked out plans for continuing services of an agency whose work was badly needed in the community when lack of funds threatened to close it."

"It set up a Teen Center which operates every afternoon and evening at the work of a Senior Citizens Center for older men and women."

"It worked out a plan for cooperation between public schools, churches and social agencies. It conducted a public relations institute for volunteer workers in members. It held training institutes for child welfare workers, recreation leaders and camp counselors."

"It operated a Social Service Exchange, a Central Information Bureau, and a Volunteer Service Bureau."

"It set up a Teen Center which operates every afternoon and evening at the work of a Senior Citizens Center for older men and women."

"NOW NO TWO COUNCILS are ever exactly alike," said Charles Mentzer. "However, the specific activities of a well-organized council can usually be grouped under six headings: coordination; fact-finding; joint action; improving quality of service; providing common services; and developing public understanding."

Worked Mentzer to name some of the problems of our gray flannel group.

He groaned.

"The area is transient to a great degree. The rising young executives are constantly on the move."

"There are definite sub-standard housing areas which no-one seems aware of."

"Talents of older retired men and women are being ignored, when they have had but a few years to use in many ways in the community."

"There's not nearly enough provision for leisure-time activity on a community level for teen-agers."

"There is great need for hospital facilities, especially emergency and out-patient service."

"People are wringing their hands over changes that are taking place, rather than intelligently planning for the future."

"I WANT ME TO GO ON?"

"THE OUTSTANDING child welfare problems of the area seem to be emotional disturbance and poor school adjustment; failure of foster homes; and social 'pressure' on children in families with modest and small incomes."

Alcoholism absence parents and broken homes are being recognized as contributing most of the cases of emotional disturbance and poor school adjustment."

"Serious consideration should be given to the advisability of eliminating social clubs in the Birmingham school system."

Mentzer tracked into a brief case and pulled out a copy of the Sampson report which he had quoted. It has 70 pages of list spaced typewritten lines. It is nearly half an inch thick. It lists areas of personal and group need in our community."

"Charles Mentzer is the man chosen to help the community meet these needs. He is professionally trained, widely experienced, highly capable."

He is here to help you. But he must have your help, your understanding, your support if he is to do the job."
