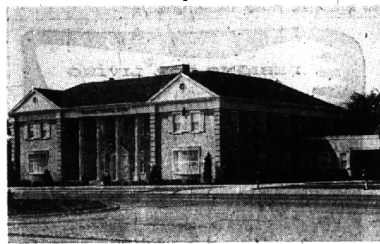


President of Frat
