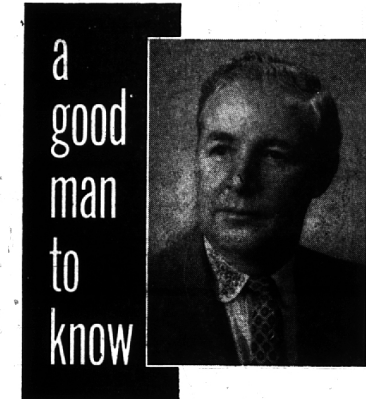


Hills Jr. Hi PTA Gets New Officers

Head Count Set for May

The annual school census will be taken throughout the Birmingham school district during the last 20 days in May, Superintendent B. Ireland announced today.

The purpose of the school census is to determine the number of children in each age group up to 20 years of age, as an index of the possible service to be rendered by the schools, as a basis for planning physical, instructional and financial needs and as a means for distributing primary school interest funds. The school census is used as a legal base for these allocations.

Enumerators will contact every family in the area assigned to them. The adult count will be used for a yearly population census. Badges signed by the Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Dwight B. Ireland, will be worn on the outer clothing. All information, which is required by state law, will be confidential, Dr. Ireland said.

The enumerators will be prepared to give the dates of the various kindergarten roundups to parents with children who will be five years old on or before December 1, 1959.

To the Editor:
Industry has been very generous to schools in this area, and there is effective cooperation between our schools and industry.

One significant area which has not been fully explored is the summer employment of outstanding high school seniors who might also work part-time while in college. Even though temporary employees often do not earn their salaries in full, an opportunity is given to both the student and the company to see if permanent employment after college graduation is desired. Students cannot learn what employers want in classrooms alone; no better way to make education practical and meaningful is available than to arrange for summer employment of superior students. We do not want the Russian requirement of industrial work prior to college, but we do need to give our young people a chance to learn what goes on in business today and decide what kind of job would be of greatest interest, so that they can properly prepare for it.

SEVERAL of our best chemistry and physics students have asked me to aid them in obtaining summer jobs with firms doing research work, even if their work is carrying mail or opening boxes. Although I am having difficulty in arranging for suitable jobs, I am confident that companies concerned with the quality of their future employees will offer summer jobs to our outstanding students.

Birmingham public schools are fortunate in having in this area parents personally concerned with the quality of education their children receive; these parents are employed by companies actively working to assist the schools in providing the best possible education.

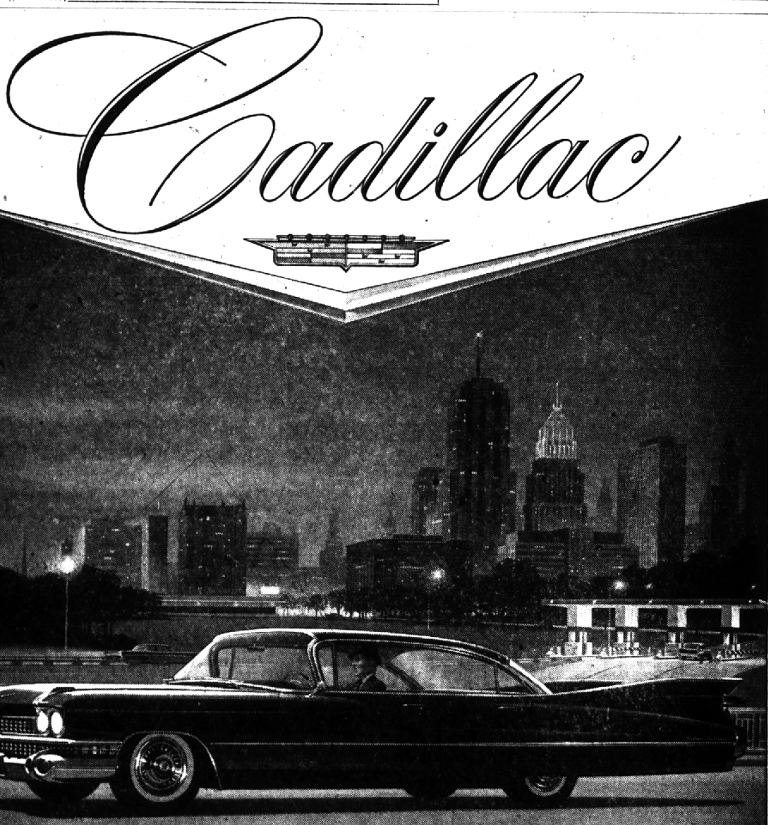
