# Tell your story. Give the editor all the facts and necessary details, including full names and addresses of local persons involved and identifying titles. Be an impartal, dependable and discriminating news source. Following these basic rules will go far in getting any editor to welcome you with open arms: 1. Type your story, double spaced, on one side of an 8½ by 11½ sheet of paper. Stories written in longhand invite errors, and few editors have time to telephone for translaerrors, and few editors have time to telephone for transia-tions! 2. At the top of the sheet type your name, address, tele-phone number, the subject of your publicity (such as EZ Club Meeting), and the date on which it may be released. 3. Keep the story short—one page if possible. Avoid ad-jectives and the glowing tribute—they re out of date and no longer acceptable. Don't write headlines. That's the editor's

job.

4. Get your story to the editor as soon as possible. Most news printed in the women's or society section can be written well in advance of a planned event. If the editor has it early, she will be able to give it more time and to follow-up, through you, any aspects of the story which seem of particular interest.
