Southfield-12 Mile Shop Center Tabled

SOUTHFIELD—Tabled again after a stormy public hearing in Southfield last week, the proposed 12 Mile-Southfield shopping center has gone back to the city's zoning advisory board for further discussion.

The proposed commercial development has been watched with interest by neighboring communities crossed by Southfield road. Only last month Beverly Hills granted the ERO zoning which will permit construction this summer of a branch store at the corner of Southfield and 14 Mile.

Other property owners between 13 and 14 Mile on Southfield road in Beverly Hills have sought commercial or ERO zoning.

The one and a half million dollar, 14-store development proposed for Southfield just north of 12 Mile subdivision was opposed every move to rezone the five acres just north of the hardware store on the road's east side.

THE RESIDENTS claim deed restrictions set up more than 12 years ago made all Southfield road property north of 12 Mile road residential. The Southfield planning commission recommended the zoning change. But council members differed, stalling action until a vote.

The proposed shopping center would include eight specialty shops, a linen and curtain store, sandwich shop, jewelry, drug, furniture and appliance stores.


