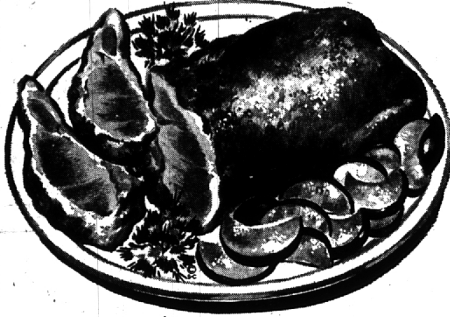

National Education Week Going Strong At Poppleton School

TROY — The contrast between the old and the new in schools is the theme being used by the primary grades at Poppleton school for National Education week. A comparison is being made between the schools of the early 'settler' and our schools as to curriculum, equipment, buildings, and transportation. Some of the rooms have book displays showing the wealth of reading material now available.
