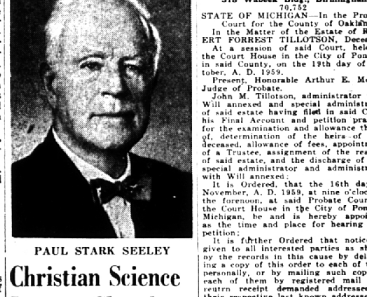
### Present 'Our Town'
