Under the Snow--That Lawn's Still There

Bill's lawn was magnificent throughout the fall. Thick, springy and rich green, it went into the winter looking like a picture in a fertilizer advertisement. When spring came around, Bill was amazed to find his beautiful lawn now covered with flattened, sick, dishwater-blond patches.

A favorite fungicide that has worked well in his area. Little can be done after the grass starts to grow in mid-April, so further treatment should be deferred until fall. If a lawn has been severely damaged by snow mold, it is particularly important not to shock the grass further by the application of a harsh, quick-acting fertilizer. A garden supply dealer can no doubt supply one of the new "Urea-Form" 10-6-4's of which the gentle action and steady feeding will insure complete recovery of the injured turf.
