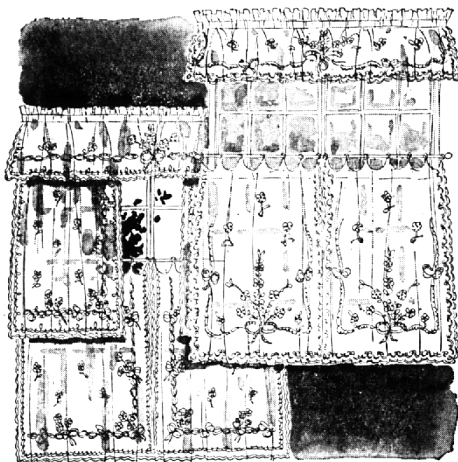
## North Woods Branch Sets Friday Meet
