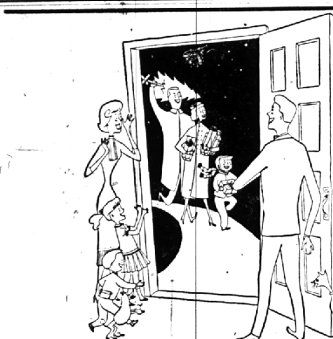

Busy Burglar; His Score: 24 In 3 1/2 Years
 Another six points were racked up this week by the burglar who recently admitted breaking into 18 Birmingham homes in a five-year period. His total now stands at 24.
 Robert McGinnis, 29, of 7840 Katherine Taylor, Mich., who was arrested by State Police on burglary charges, admitted the additional breakings and entering to Birmingham Detective Lieutenant Merlin L. Holmquist.
 THE SAFE he had taken from the home of William C. Faulkner, 1611 Yorkshire, was found last December in Dearborn township. He had taken \$790 in cash as well as jewelry from the Faulkner home.
 He took Christmas presents from the Matthew B. Whittlesey home at 1288 Washington boulevard a day before.
 HE TOOK \$800 in cash, Holmquist said, from the home of Cyril G. Geymann, 1816 Northlawn in June 1958, and \$325 in cash from 2328 Radnor in March of that year.
 He got some rings at 607 Piquette, and 361 Shirley empty-handed, the detective went on.
 McGinnis, on trial in Pontiac justice court, refused to disclose his method of disposing of the loot.
 "He said he had some means of getting rid of the stolen property outside the state," Holmquist said.

Social Security Asks Housewives For 'Help' Reports
 The Pontiac district social security office reported that many housewives in Oakland county are not reporting household help for social security purposes.
 "As little as \$4 per week in cash earnings totals more than \$50 a month and should be reported to the director of internal revenue," said Manager William E. LaRock.
 LaRock explained reporting is easier than many housewives think. Upon request, internal revenue service mails a report form each calendar quarter as a reminder. The report has form of an envelope. The housewife enters her name, social security number and total cash earnings. She puts a check or money order in it to cover the social security tax and mails the sealed envelope to the address already printed on it.

Age No Factor In Accidents
 Accidents know no peer as a killer of young people, the national safety council reports. It cites this evidence:
 More persons 15-24 years of age die in accidents than from all diseases and other causes combined.
 Accidents are the leading cause of death among persons in the 1-35 age group.
 The motor vehicle is the No. 1 accidental death-dealer among persons aged 5-74. Falls are No. 2.
 THE COUNCIL says accidents cost the nation nearly 12 billion dollars a year.
 Nearly one in three hospital emergency-room patients is an accident victim. Accident victims spend more time in the hospital, on the average, than other patients.
 An American is hurt in an accident every three seconds. One person is killed every six minutes.
 "These are pretty shocking statistics," the council said. "They certainly emphasize the urgent need for keeping a sharp eye out for hazards."
