Board OK's First Draft School Plan

Preliminary plans for the low, trim, flat-roofed Westchester school today have the Birmingham Board of Education's stamp of tentative approval, as does the new building's site.

The elementary school is to be built on a 400 foot square site at the southwest corner of Cranbrook and W. Maple.

DESIGNED by Eberle M. Smith, Associates, Inc., Birmingham architects, the school will be built the classroom cluster, court plan used in the recently occupied Wylie T. Groves high school, Beverly Hills.

First phase of construction, explained architect Tobj J. Gerabach, calls for a 16-classroom structure. This will be in addition to an all-purpose room, kitchen, and administration areas.

Six classrooms and two kindergarten rooms could be added easily, according to present blueprints. PART of the eventual administration area could be used for kindergarten purposes at first, Gerabach said.



The Race, The Tests are on

CRANBROOK—Cranbrook Institute of Science is putting on a free public lecture in Detroit at the Rackham building, at 8:15 p.m., Friday, Nov. 27. Subject: "America's Missile-Test Activities." Speaker is Colonel Liston T. Taylor, (inset), Chief of the Special Projects Office, Air Force Missile Test Center, Patrick Air Force Base, Florida. A native of Kentucky, Colonel Taylor entered the military service in 1942. He was graduated from the University of Louisville with a B.S. degree in chemical engineering and completed post graduate study at Ohio State. Last year he was awarded the Legion of Merit for distinguished service at ARDA Headquarters for the period from August, 1955, to August, 1958. Slides and a film in color will dramatically show many kinds of missiles in action (such as the Atlas, pictured above) and will illustrate the precautions taken and the methods used to track long-range missiles down the Atlantic Range. Colonel Taylor will also comment on the role the Air Force will play in the forthcoming attempt to put a man into space. Questions and answers will follow the lecture. No tickets are required.

Mayor Proclaims 'Good Turn Day' In Birmingham

Mayor Harry M. Denvers, Jr., today urged the people of Birmingham to help the boy scouts help Goodwill industries by filling a "good turn" bag with clothing.

With 20 other mayors and village presidents in the Detroit Boy Scout Council area, Denvers issued the following proclamation:

"BECAUSE THE Boy Scouts of America, Detroit Area Council, will conduct the largest clothing drive ever attempted in this country on Saturday, Nov. 28, and because this area-wide 'good turn' will be undertaken on behalf of physically handicapped men and women at Goodwill industries of Detroit with 35,000 to 40,000 boy scouts and explorer scouts distributing goodwill bags to 400,000 homes on Nov. 21 a week before the drive, and

"Because the collection of discarded is seasonal and it is necessary for Goodwill industries to have a backlog of material from which to draw, which prevents layoffs of handicapped people during the year, and

"BECAUSE BOTH the boy scouts and Goodwill industries conduct community projects based on a positive and constructive approach to social and economic problems affecting our youth and the physically handicapped, and

"Because the drive necessitates the full cooperation of everyone in the area, and will benefit our community socially and economically."

"Therefore, I urge each of you to fill a 'Good Turn' bag and place it in front of your home before 10 a.m., November 28, to be collected by the boy scout in your neighborhood. I officially proclaim November 28 'Good Turn Day' as a community-wide project."

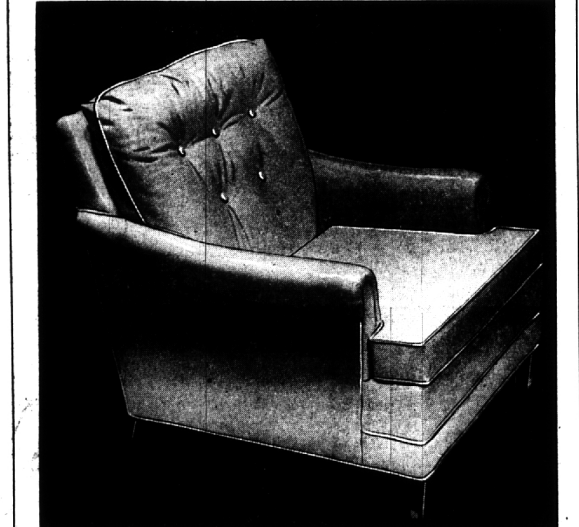
