

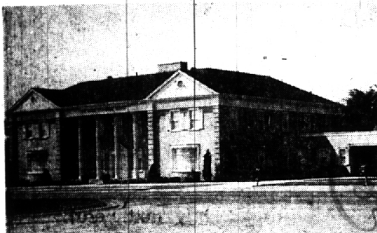
Broadcast First Baptist Services
