A statewide organizing drive sparked by 14 regional organizing committees was launched last week by Citizens for Michigan.

George Romney, chairman of Bloomfield Hills, President of American Motors, said the state has been divided into 14 regions for organizing purposes...

WITH A current membership of nearly 2,000 from more than 200 Michigan communities, the group seeks maximum enrollment of all citizens willing to participate...

"Crossroads" study groups will be local chapters, to be chartered on a community or neighborhood basis within each region...

To systemize the studies of local groups, four major study areas have been determined, including state services and needs, governmental organization required to meet these needs...

PRINCIPLES of membership are: 1) Members shall be guided by a concept of service and participation that shall place the needs of the state above and apart from personal, political, economic or social affiliations.

2) Members shall seek to keep themselves informed as to the fundamental political and economic facts on the state's needs and problems.

3) MEMBERS in their capacity as citizens shall actively participate in the study of problems and formulation of recommendations for solutions that are in the best interests of all citizens and consumers of the state.

4) Members shall recognize that any position with respect to Michigan needs that is contrary to the national interest or world welfare would be in the long run contrary to the interests of Michigan.

Teams of CFM directors have been assigned to organize work in 14 regions. The Oakland county team includes Martin Hutzel, C. Allen Harlan, and Mrs. Berrien C. Ketchum of Birmingham...

A 22-year-old Birmingham man, sentenced to jail for 30 days in a Birmingham municipal court, must wait until Dec. 16 before starting the 180-day sentence handed down by Judge John C. Emery.

Robert M. Lane, 2107 Windmere, is now serving 30 days in the Oakland county jail as a result of drunk and disorderly conduct Nov. 17 in Southfield town-ship justice court.

LANE WAS found sleeping in the bedroom of a Beverly Hills home in which his 17-year-old girl friend was baby-sitting.

The charge in the Birmingham court was reckless driving. Lane is also on one year's probation on a non-support charge.

DONALD J. Buchanan, 35, of Detroit paid an \$11 fine and three dollars court costs on a speeding charge.

Waino W. Wilkainen, 45, of 3684 W. Maple, Bloomfield township, was fined \$15 and three dollars costs for speeding and running a stop sign.
