Birmingham Unitarians will install their new minister, the Rev. Lester Mondale, at 4 p.m. the next Sunday.  
Coming from Boston to participate in the program will be Dr. Dana McLean Greeley, president of the American Unitarian association. Assisting in the installation of Mr. Mondale will be the Rev. Harold P. Marley, minister of the Abraham Lincoln Unitarian Fellowship of Springfield, Ill., who is a close personal friend of Mr. Mondale.

The new church located on 3 1/2 acres on the northwest corner of Lone Pine and Woodward, was designed by Minoru Yamasaki, renowned Birmingham architect.  
Taking advantage of the gently rolling site, the four contemporary buildings surround a three-level courtyard. Plastic-domed colonnades and covered walkways connect the buildings, three educational units and a larger social hall, at present used for church services.

The history includes the early days of home meetings, services held in the Community House, the Apple Orchard school, the YMCA, the Upton school in Royal Oak and since September of this year in the new permanent location in Bloomfield Hills.
