DOWN TO EARTH

Decoration Hints Given for Holidays

Recently garden club members of Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills had Zelda Schulke from Brecksville, Ohio, as their speaker, the author of "A Treasury of Christmas Decorations," and creates exotic effects from commonplace materials.

Her many tips for decorations should be shared by all. Two important pointers to assure success in your home is to follow one dominant color scheme and develop the scale of the project in the right proportion to its location.

If you create decorations at any time of the year, be sure and have a 28 gauge wire. Secure spools of brown, green and white floral tape. You will want a couple cans of spray paints, preferably gold and white.

For treating the corrugated box or the spray will float through the air onto furniture.

If you choose to spray broadleaf evergreens (rhododendrons) treat the leaves first in glycerin or the spray won't cover it satisfactorily.

For treating the outer doorway Mrs. Schulke still likes to make her swags using a metal coathanger as a base. She suggests having the center flat, adding an eye-catching trinket, with a bow for an accent.

WHEN YOU apply the spray paint be sure and spray into it.

B'ham to Berlin

BECAUSE SO many of us are blessed with a storm door and wonder how to glorify it, she suggests cutting a peg board to match the size of a portion or the whole door and place on it a motif which could be a swag or a greeting appropriate to the occasion. Of course, you will paint the pegboard a flattering color for the planned decorations.

You would have to go a long way to surpass the Della Robbins wreath for accenting a fireplace or a plain wall. She suggests that you cut a piece of tree with regular wire and then nestle it into a wreath of greens.

SHE SHOWED US an interesting tree form of plywood. On it she shows an arrangement of lights and then nestled corners into it to form a pattern. To cover the raw edges of the plywood she used a regular wire and then nestle it into a wreath of greens.

Using the number 18 gauge wire she created colorful spirals on candles, taped with colorful decorations.

STYROFOAM TREES will be on the market in all sizes this year. She showed them with stripes of one-half inch ribbons placed up and down the height of tree with a part of the pattern of velvet ribbon. They were held in place with pearl corsage pins and occasionally a small motif of the season on the plain white styrofoam. Large styrofoam balls to decorate the tree were made in the same way.

She suggested spraying deep picture frames and creating a Christmas scene inside with an appropriate background secured by Elmers' glue.

TAKE A PLYWOOD base of picture size and -at the top and bottom hammer on a moulding using copper screening for the background. Glue on it a colorful Christmas detail.

Mrs. Schulke's son made a Christmas tree constructed from three triangles glued together and painted black. He glued on cut out pictures from Bible stories, each section telling its separate story. The tree was placed on a lamp base for height.
