Seat Belts Cut Injury Chances,

Consider these bits of information as you whip down the highway in your car:

- 1) Seat belts cut your chances of getting hurt in an auto accident in half.
- 2) The risk of death or serious injury in an auto wreck is five times greater if you're hurled from your car than if you remain inside.
- 3) Safety seats estimate 5,000 lives could be saved annually if seat belts were universally used in cars.

IS THE RISK of being thrown from your car in a crash exaggerated?

According to the experts, an Indiana state police study for example, showed that in actual crashes, 55 per cent of the drivers opened. Of the persons killed, 47 per cent were thrown from the car.

ORDINANCE NO. 154
CITY OF BIRMINGHAM
AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 153
AN ORDINANCE to amend Ordinance No. 153 to make it an ordinance of nuisance to cause or permit dirt or other material to be deposited on streets from trucks and other motor vehicles.

THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM ORDINANCE NO. 158 of the City of Birmingham hereby amended by adding in Section 4 thereof an additional section 4-14 to read as follows:

14—The owning, driving or moving upon public streets and alleys of trucks or other motor vehicles which are constructed or loaded so as to permit any part of the load or contents to fall, or be deposited upon, any street, sidewalk or public place, or to spill, or which deposits from its wheels, tires or other parts thereof dirt, mud, oil, grease or other public or private nuisance, shall, in addition to other penalties, be subject to the provisions of all other city licenses and permits for the operation of such vehicles, and shall be a misdemeanor, the commission of which is determined by the City Manager to be in the public interest. He may arrest any person temporarily exempt from the provisions of this ordinance upon violation of such conditions of license, and may execute a warrant for the arrest of any person who shall be found in violation of this ordinance by the City in connection with this ordinance.

Ordained this 18th day of November, A.D. 1939, by the Commission of the City of Birmingham, to be effective upon publication.
