AFTER A brief question and answer period, Lt. Lewis Tew, Administrative Services and Personnel officer, 2497th Air Reserve Flying center, Selfridge AFB, provided many helpful pointers on Air Force cooperation and coordination with this program.

The Air Explorer phase of the meeting was concluded with the film presentation of "This is Exploring", a current filming of explorers actual programs and events in several cities.

THE AFA squadron's order of business was reversed to permit the explorers to view "The Story of the X-17", an Air Force documentary on the development of the missile which provided the solution to the problem of re-entry into the earth's atmosphere of hypersonic speeds.

This notice is published in accordance with CHAPTER XI, Section 3 of the Charter of the City of Birmingham, and Resolution No. 1074 (1959).
