(Continued from Page 1-E) has been reduced from a two-year to a one-year course, said emphasis is being made on history from the 17th century forward.

"SPEAKING" FOR the "live" language department, which includes French, Spanish and German, Dean LaFare outlined the aims in teaching these subjects. The primary aim is to make the student proficient in conversation; secondly, to create an interest in foreign cultures and thirdly to give a good grammar base for advanced study.

Latin is not a "dead" language as taught by Mrs. Audrey Zahow-sky. She teaches it from the angle of its contribution to the English language (65 per cent of our words stem from Latin). It also is an aid in understanding English grammar, according to Mrs. Zahow-sky. "Historical mythology and its basis for comprehending the romance languages are more important in the study of Latin than just plain translation," she said.

A new course in the humanities was discussed by teacher Donald Dennis. Subjects touched upon in the course are music, art, philosophy, religion and politics. "They are important as a means of communication of man to man, as a study of cultures, and an appreciation of aesthetics," he said.

Vocal music by Clarence Luchman, counseling by Mrs. Mary White and William Schaar, and natural science by Marion Handley were also ably presented to the group.
