The main characters, in addition to the analyst, include his fiancée, a play-happy patient, and a movie star who believes that his wife walked out on him because of the analyst's advice — all of which adds up to an imaginative and fast-paced comedy.

A strong supporting cast includes Mrs. Jean Steding as Miss Tacher, Francis Lead as Grant Collier, John Allman as Dr. Krauss, Weston Meyer as Arthur Turner, and Mrs. Robert Scott as Mildred Turner.
