Junior Fire Marshalls To Start Safety Drive

BEVERLY HILLS.—Beverly Hills junior fire marshalls, along with some four million fellow members of this nationwide fire prevention brigade, take up the cudgels for fire safety here Oct. 5 with a flurry of activities to highlight National Fire Prevention Week.

The upcoming junior fire marshalls program will emphasize the fundamentals of fire safety in the home and at school, according to Ray E. Becker of Sheridan road.

The H. W. Becker Agency sponsors the year-round program locally in cooperation with Principal Noah Blasier of the Greenfield school and the Fire Department under Chief Robert Murphy.

"The junior fire marshalls brigade of six-to-ten-year-old grade school youngsters is the largest and one of the most effective fire prevention groups in the country today," Becker declared. "Created nationally in 1947 by the Hartford Fire Insurance Co., the program at ready has trained more than 30 million boys and girls in the fundamentals of fire safety—instilling in them safe habits they will carry with them through life."

BECKER CITED the importance of this public service program for school children by pointing to the staggering losses from fire last year. "Here in the U.S., more than \$1-billion in property went up in flames," he said. "An estimated 11,600 persons lost their lives—nearly one-third of them, children under 14."

Keystone of the program is the home inspection report. To qualify as a junior fire marshalls, youngsters must make a fire hazard check of their own homes, complete the inspection report and return it, signed by their parents, to their teacher.

THOSE WHO complete their home reports fully and accurately will receive official junior fire marshalls sashes and red plastic fire helmets.

Becker said that elementary grade school teachers here will receive teaching material from the agency as aids to classroom fire prevention studies.

FIRE CHIEF Robert Murphy will display some of the fire fighting equipment of the department from 10 to 11 a.m. Oct. 5 at the Greenfield school, Fairfax and 13 Mile roads. Members of the department will be present to explain the operation of the equipment and answer the questions of the students.

Becker urged all parents to cooperate with junior fire marshalls help make Beverly Hills a safer place to live.

S'field Curriculum Study Groups To Meet Oct. 7

SOUTHFIELD.—The advisory committee of the citizen curriculum study of Southfield public schools will meet at 8 p.m. Oct. 7 at the high school.

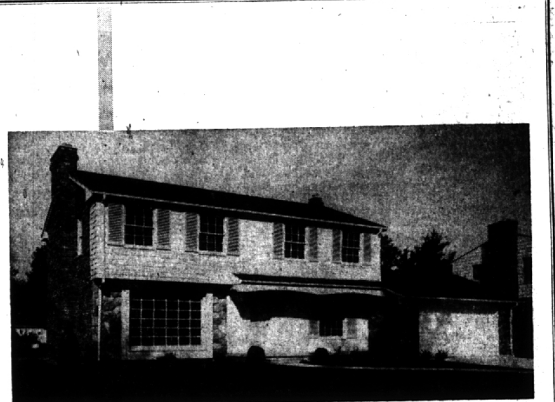

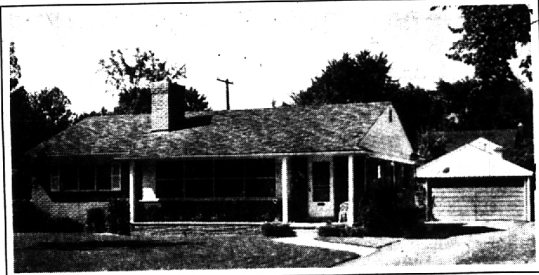

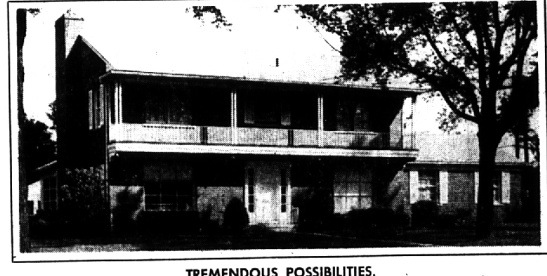
