A December 26 wedding is planned.

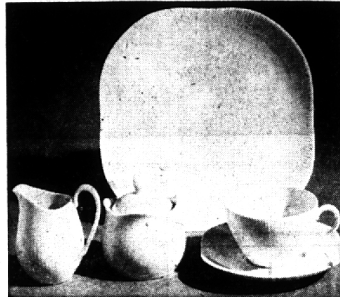
