The three advisors have publicly declared they believe the county DPW should be the negotiating agency for the county in talks with Detroit.

Currently assigned to carry out the negotiations is the Southeast Michigan water authority, formed by Oakland and Macomb counties three years ago to build a water pipeline to Lake Huron. Officials of the two counties decided recently to drop the Huron pipeline project if an agreement could be reached for Detroit to supply the two counties with water.

County Raises Officials' Pay. Vets Named Again

Two veteran county officials were re-appointed to their long-held positions and given raises last week by the Oakland county board of supervisors.

The men are Auditor John C. Austin, who first worked for the county in 1925, and John A. MacDonald, welfare board chairman, whose county commission dates from 1939. Austin's salary was raised from \$12,000 to \$13,250 per year. MacDonald got an increase from \$9,500 to \$10,500.

THREE OTHER salaried officers got raises with their re-appointments at the supervisors' annual October session. Norman K. Barnard, corporation counsel, was raised from \$12,500 to \$13,000. Salaries of civil defense director Lewis C. Jarrett and Dog Warden Dr. Frank H. Bates were increased \$500 to \$7,000 and \$7,200 each.

Re-appointed to the board of public works, whose members are paid \$15 per day plus expenses, were board of supervisors Chairman Delos Hamlin and Berkeley Supervisor John G. Semann.

Remained as planning commissions, who serve without pay, were J. Robert F. Swanson, Robert A. Main, James P. Spruce and Vincent S. Madison.

None of the incumbents up for re-appointment was opposed.

Suggests Using Empty Hospital As Ward's School

The use of the former Oakland county contagious hospital as a home under one roof for the juvenile division's school program has been suggested by Mrs. Asa W. Bonner of Ferndale, chairman of the board of supervisors' juvenile committee.

The hospital has been vacant since August, 1958. It would house the school program for juvenile court wards, which currently is carried on in seven classrooms at the children's center on Telegraph and four rooms at the youth home on Cooley lake road.

Rooms at the children's center are "make-shift and entirely too small" for use as classrooms for

as many as 47 children per room, Mrs. Bonner said.

By 5 Assessed Property Owners Royal Oak Sued

ROYAL OAK — Five law suits have been filed against the city of Royal Oak by property owners who challenge the city's assessment for downtown business area redevelopment.

The city plans to build a pedestrian mall on Washington and

put in free parking for 3400 cars. Assessments against benefiting business property owners would be used to pay the estimated \$2.8 million cost.

County Home Rule Symposium Slated At MSUO Oct. 21

Oakland's city, county and township officials have been invited to a day-long symposium on county home rule Oct. 21 at the MSUO campus. The program is to appraise possibilities county home rule may offer toward solving government problems of growing counties like Oakland, its sponsors say. Sponsors are the MSUO continuing education department, the Institute for community development of MSUO, and the Greater Pontiac Community Council.

Interested persons may register with the MSUO continuing education department by writing or phoning before Friday, Oct. 16. Other registrations will be accepted at the meeting if space permits.

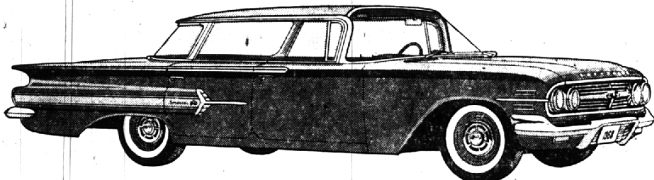
