Zoning Set-up To Be Changed In Bloomfield

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP—Township officials laid plans at a meeting of the township board Monday night, for creation of a planning commission to take place of the present township zoning board.
The change will take place when a recently passed law in the state legislature takes effect 90 days after the adjournment of the present session.
The new law replaces township zoning boards with planning commissions. Their functions will not be changed, although the new law is more specific in defining the duties of the planning commissions.

ANDREW SNIVELY and Robert Boyer, members of Bloomfield's present zoning board, appeared before the township board to discuss plans for the change-over.
Though no specific action was taken, present plans are to increase the planning commission to seven members. The zoning board has five. Under the new law, a member of the township zoning board of appeals must be appointed to the planning commission.
