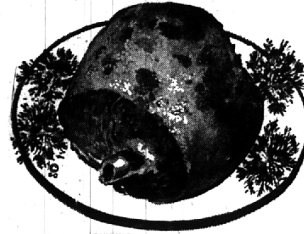

SOUTHFIELD — Southfield's temporary fire hall on the northeast corner of 12 Mile and Evergreen roads was opened today, giving protection to the northern sector of the city.
