To the Editor:

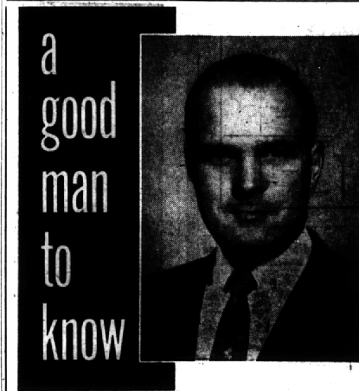

AFS Reps Meet in Detroit

Mrs. Douglas Morrison will represent the Bloomfield Hills chapter of American Field service at a regional conference of AFS volunteers in the Pick-Fort Shelby Hotel in Detroit on Oct. 24 and 25. Representatives from Michigan, Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania will be present.

Mrs. Morrison is AFS chapter coordinator for the American ABroad Program.

THE PURPOSE of the conference is to discuss all aspects of the AFS programs as well as to formulate plans for the growth and development of AFS.

Representatives will be welcomed by Mrs. Stephen Galatti, Director general of American Field service. The keynote address will be delivered by Mrs. George Romney, wife of the president of American Motors, and an AFS foster mother last year.

THE AFS program, which brings students from all over the world to the United States for a year to live as members of American families and to attend the senior year of high school, is sponsoring 1,525 students from 47 countries this year.

THE AMERICAN Field service also sends Americans abroad for a summer's experience living with a foreign family. This past summer there were 960 students, between their junior and senior year of high school, in 24 countries.

A group of Americans from this same age range is also given the opportunity of studying for a semester in a foreign school while living with a family. At the present time 120 students are staying in 11 countries under this program.

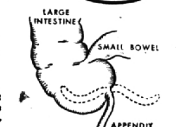
Appendix Has No Known Function

- Stitch
- Pile Ointments

Q. I have never understood just where the appendix is, what it's good for, or what it looks like. Can you explain?
A. The appendix is a finger-like projection measuring up to several inches in length which lies in the lower right part of the abdominal cavity. It is attached to the blind end of the large intestine and may be found in various positions in relation to the bowel (see illustration). When the appendix becomes inflamed we have the well-known condition of appendicitis. The appendix is a sort of leftover structure that has no known function.

Q. What causes side ache or "stitch" during strenuous exercise or rapid walking?
A. Various theories have been proposed to account for "stitch" but none seem to offer an entirely satisfactory explanation. The pain probably arises in the diaphragm or breathing muscles.

Q. Is there any treatment for internal and external hemorrhoids?



Should other than surgery? Are the highly advertised sales of any value?—Brockton.
A. Reputable proctologists (rectal specialists) agree that surgical removal of hemorrhoids is the method of choice. Injection methods are very often employed and these may give welcome relief. The great variety of pile ointments, suppositories and other rectal medication offered to the public would indicate the simple, effective rub-it-on method hasn't been found (and probably never will be).

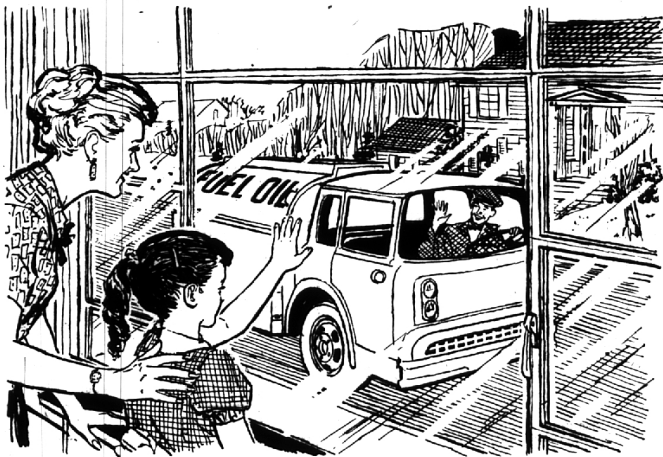
