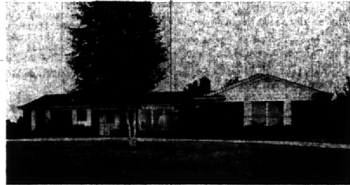

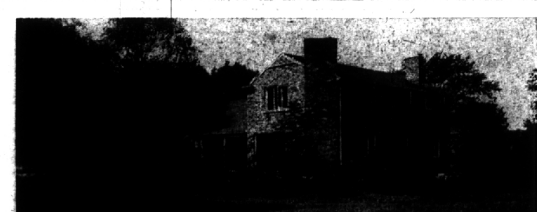

Maple-Telegraph Improvement Work To Start Soon

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — The Maple and Telegraph intersection, termed the most dangerous corner in Michigan by the state highway department, will have a face-lifting within the next year to improve the left and right-turn situation.
As a result of a traffic survey conducted there, road officials have authorized northbound left-turn storage strip and islands and a right-turn lane.
According to John A. Wills, district No. 9 engineer, bids for the work will be taken Nov. 4. Sewer and underground work will be done during the winter, Wills said, but actual road improvements will not be possible until the spring.
The project is slated for completion in August of next year.

Lathrup Police Ticket 30 Juvenile Offenders

LATHRUP—Does your child know that bicycles are governed by all the rules of good driving that control car safety?

"We are clamping down on careless bike riders and children who walk in the roads when they could use the sidewalks," said Lathrup's Police Chief Tom Tellefson, Monday morning, adding that 30 juvenile traffic tickets have been issued recently.
"Young bike riders should know that they may ride on the sidewalks in Lathrup, however a good rider will keep as far to the right as possible," Tellefson said. "Where sidewalks are not provided, bike riders must obey all the rules governing cars, driving to the right and observing all safety rules and regulations."

"WHEN sidewalks are not provided," Tellefson continued, "and it is necessary to walk in the road, children should be taught to stay close to the side of the road facing traffic."

Four young bicycle riders, guilty of riding four abreast, have been instructed to appear before Juvenile Officer Ward Jenks with both parents at the next court session.

According to Tellefson, of the 30 juvenile tickets issued recently, five were acknowledged, one with thanks from a grateful parent. One was with a note from an outraged mother who thought it unfair to ticket her 16-year-old when three and four-year olds create greater traffic hazards by riding tricycles and playing in the city streets.

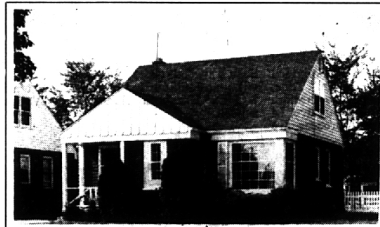

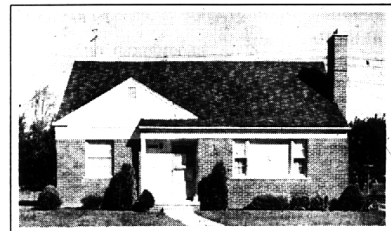
