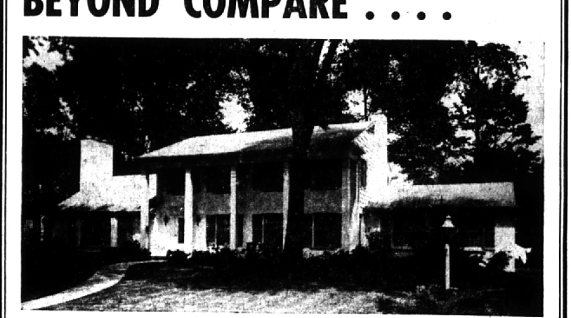
Lathrup to Get Permanent Christmas Tree
