Foot Bros., Detroit. Mrs. Bryant's mother, Mrs. Virg Blinn, formerly of Birmingham, resides with them.

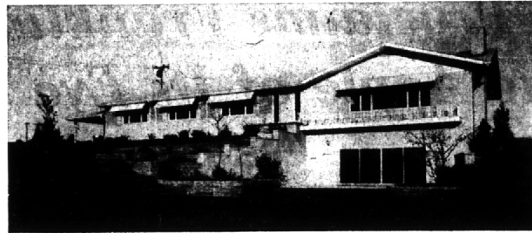
