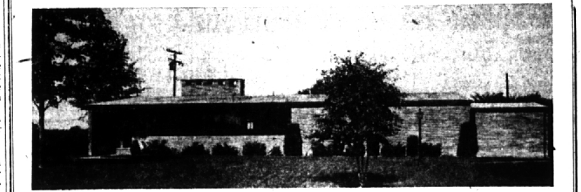
Area Students Study Nature At Kensington
