 A 40-bed building is proposed for the northeast corner of 10 Mile and Lahser by the Detroit Osteopathic hospital group.

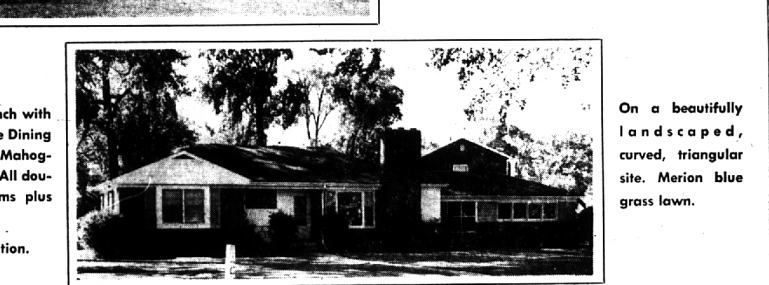
