### Rezoning Hearings Slated for Oct. 12 By City Commission

The Birmingham City Commission will hold hearings on the rezoning of four lots scattered throughout the city, Monday, Oct. 12.

The Plan Board's recommendation differs in each case.

IT IS RECOMMENDED denial of the petition of Dr. A. L. McLaughlin to rezone the northeast corner of Southfield and Townsend from R-7 multiple family to B-3 (non-retail business).

The board recommended approval of the request of Edmund P. and Maria Brennan and Mrs. Carrie Johnson to rezone the northeast corner of Daines and Parley from R-6 multiple family zoning to B-1.

The request of Mr. and Mrs. H. J. Quinn to rezone two lots on the southeast corner of Westchester Way and West Maple from R-1 single-family residential to an R-4 two family residential classification has been withdrawn by Forbes S. Hascall, Quinn's attorney.

A hearing will be called and the request will then be announced as withdrawn.
