2 Students Hurt By Firecracker at SHS Football Game

Two Birmingham teen-agers were injured at the Seaholm high school-Hazel Park football game Friday night when another youth panicked and threw a "cherry bomb" fire-cracker into the crowd.

The thrower—a teenaged boy—was apprehended Tuesday by juvenile department officer Jack Kalbfleisch.

"THERE WAS apparently no intent to do harm," Kalbfleisch said. "But even the possession of fireworks is illegal and punishable by law," he went on.

The "bomb" landed on the shoulder of Robert Cottle, 15, of 17233 Locherbie, a student at Groves high school. It burned a hole in his jacket, burned his neck, and the back of his head.

A fragment of the firecracker hit Patricia White, also 15, of 1674 Maryland, who was sitting two places away from Cottle. It broke her glasses and cut the Seaholm student under the eye.

She was treated at Boileau clinic and released. Cottle was treated in the emergency department of Beaumont hospital and released.

A veteran of World War II, Mr. Dill was a member of Acorn Post VFW, Royal Oak and Guardian Angel church in Clawson.

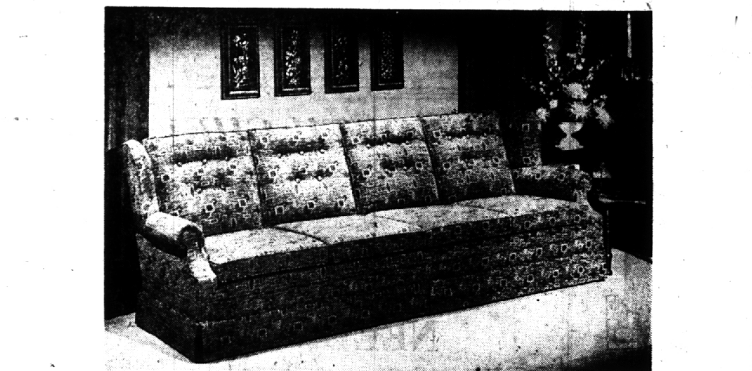

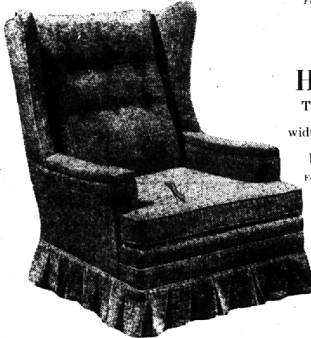
