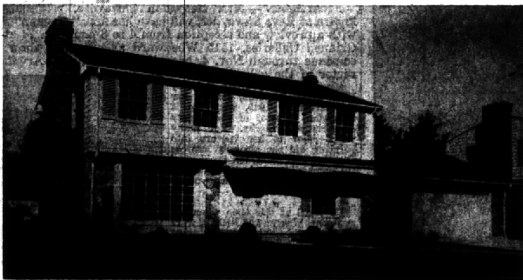

## Community Group To Elect Officers

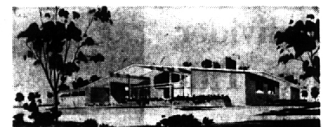
FRANKLIN—With a new community house as their goal for 1960, the Franklin Community association will hold an election of officers and a fund-raising dinner at the annual meeting and

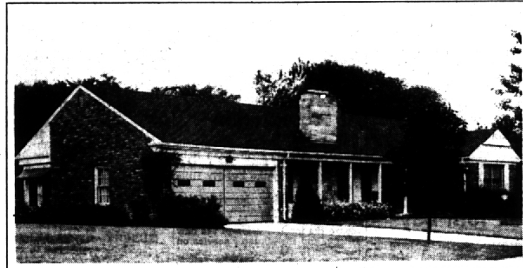

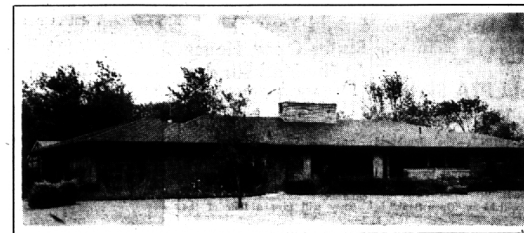
