IT WAS pointed out that preschool children rode bicycles in the road, ran into the path of oncoming

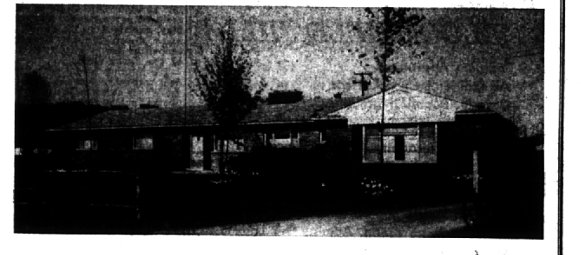
Engel Resigns Plan Commission Post in Beverly

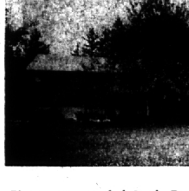

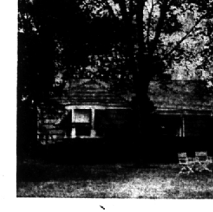

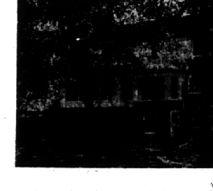
