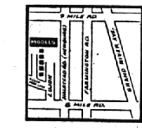

Meetings, Meetings, Meetings

LATHRUP—Meetings in Lathrup are coming so thick and fast that for the first time in years, Lathrup's regular council meetings has been moved ahead a week. To provide time for a joint meeting with Southfield, the Rouge No. 1 on Oct. 19, the council agreed to move their regular meeting ahead to Oct. 26.

BEFORE MEETING with Southfield, the council set up a Steinfurth committee engineering meeting at 7:30, Oct. 7. Raymond J. Smith, of Ayres, Lewis, Morris and May, explained to the council the plans drawn for the Steinfurth committee for a simple cleanout of the Evans ditch. The meeting set up with Southfield will be held at the House-in-the-Woods at 8 p.m. It will be open to the public for listening purpose only. The council has set Oct. 21 for a study meeting on Evergreen interceptors.

COUNCILWOMAN Elizabeth Mitchell asked City Administrator Gerald Stone to check surrounding cities in their planned methods of financing. Lathrup is scheduled to pay \$2,000 in April of next year to ward their share of the interceptors costs and \$10,000 each year thereafter. An equitable method of financing must be decided upon.

SOUTHFIELD — Parents of Southfield high students will get a chance to see what a day in Junior's school life is like Oct. 21 when the PTSA and the school will co-sponsor a "Go to School Night." School officials will conduct the evening and schedule on a short-ened basis for parents who will go from class to class just as their children did earlier in the day.

"EVERYTHING WILL be the same, aside from the shortened 15-minute classes," Principal Robert E. Hall said this week. The bell schedule will give five minutes between classes, daily announcements will be read on the public address system during a second hour and teachers will give short-ened lessons, but with no homework. Replacing the annual fall Open House, the "Go to School Night" will begin at 7 p.m.

Hills Offers Adult Ed Program

BLOOMFIELD HILLS — Adult education classes offered by Bloomfield Hills school district will begin next Monday. They will be held weekly at the high school from 8 to 10 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday nights. Scheduled for Monday night are organ lessons, taught by W. T. Wetzman, open to beginners in music; conversational French I, taught by Donald Dennis as instructor; and conversational French II, taught by Dean LaRue. Dog obedience classes, which begin Sept. 28, are also held on Monday night. Conversational Spanish, taught by Louise Dickson, stock market operation, instructed by Allen Hurd; and discussion of "Main Currents of Human Thought," given by William Mac Quisten, are classes scheduled for Tuesday evenings.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT instruction will include a modern dance group for women under Norma Carter and instructor; stock market and decorating, taught by Walter Ludwig and instructor; French, open to those with some proficiency in the language, taught by Dean LaRue. AN INTERMEDIATE class in bridge will be taught on Thursday nights by Miss Dickson; golf lessons will be under Van Loosen, PGA golf instructor; and Dr. G. L. Smith will hold a first aid class in conjunction with the American Red Cross. Registration for these courses will be held this week at the high school. Courses in typing, ballroom dancing, homemaking and badminton will also be offered, if enough people are interested.

S'field High Educational Experiment

SOUTHFIELD—Southfield high has been designated as a control school in a secondary school educational experiment being conducted by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The experiment, "The Guidance and Motivation of Superior and Talented Secondary School Students," is being administered in 100 midwestern high schools. It is designed to help develop better techniques for teaching gifted students. "IN ORDER to truly evaluate the project in these 100 schools, the NCA has selected control schools with characteristics carefully matched to those of the project schools," said Southfield high Principal Robert E. Hall this week. "We are expected to pursue a normal course of activities; the learning accomplishments to those of project, through an inventory we schools in the actual experiment," must administer to our seniors and be commented. This inventory will be given to our staff, will evaluate our teaching local seniors in November.

New 18-Acre Sub Proposed In Wood Creek

WOOD CREEK FARMS — A preliminary plan for a new 18-acre subdivision near Middlebelt and Utley roads was presented for council study and approval Tuesday night. However, since the plan includes several lots platted at 30,000 square feet, its approval seemed doubtful. Wood Creek Farms zoning requires a minimum of 35,000 square feet. Builder Joseph Cook, prospective purchaser of the land owned by Mr. and Mrs. T. McPhail of Farmington, indicated that 29 homes would be erected on the site. Seven and black-topped roads are planned. The plan shows no through streets and a single entrance at Middlebelt.
