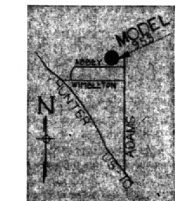
Stolen Automobile Reported in S'field

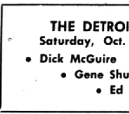
