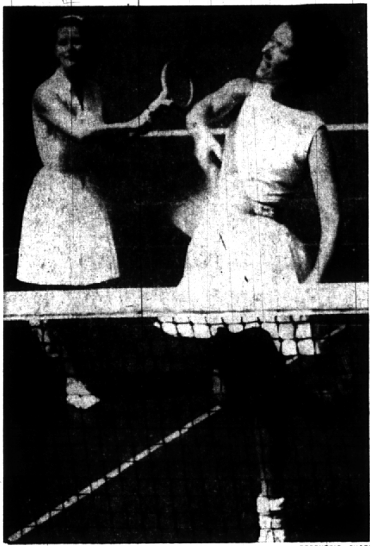


# SOCIETY
