Kiwaniquees Slate Dinner

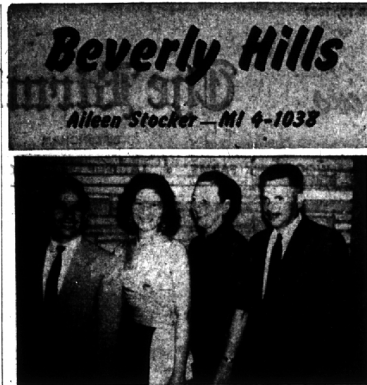
