When subdivider Rodney Lockwood balked at paying for a well water main to be installed along his 17 acre site on Evergreen road between 11 and 12 Mile road it appeared that school opening would be held up a matter of months for lack of water.

However, a well dug on the property by the construction firm will furnish an adequate supply of water for the 15 classrooms opening this fall.

**Firm to Drop Suit If ERO Rezoning OK'd by Southfield**

SOUTHFIELD—Lieberwitz-Letzell, Detroit, have agreed to drop their suit before Oakland circuit court to rezone their land to commercial if Southfield enters a consent decree for ERO (education, research and office) zoning.

Lieberwitz-Letzell is one of three companies requesting rezoning for shopping centers near 12 Mile and Southfield.

The city favors the most recent request by Rodney Lockwood, Southfield land developer for a center at 12 1/2 Mile road and Southfield. The plan commission and zoning board have approved his request and public hearing is set for Sept. 21.
