Area Church Receives 6 N. C. Wyeth Paintings

Six religious paintings by one of America's most celebrated illustrators, the late N. C. Wyeth, were unveiled last Sunday in the undercroft of the Kirk in the Hills, Bloomfield Hills.

The illustrations portraying scenes from the New Testament were acquired from the Vose galleries of Boston and donated to the Kirk by one of its officers.

IN ADDITION to the one shown above the paintings include "The Return of the Prodigal" (Luke 15); "The Barren Fig Tree" (Luke 13); "The Leavened Bread" (Matthew 13) and "The Boy Mark" (Mark 14).

In accepting the Wyeth paintings, the Rev. Dr. Harold C. DeWindt, minister, noted that "these beautiful illustrations not only capture singular scenes of deep spiritual significance for Kirk members and our visitors but they also as a group — represent a unique and illustrative addition to the growing art treasures of the greater Detroit area."

N. C. WYETH was born in Massachusetts in 1852. He produced illustrations for many children's books including "Treasure Island," "Westward Ho," and "20,000 Leagues Under the Sea."

Since his death in 1945 his stature has increased and recent exhibitions of his work have been held in important galleries in New York and museums across the country.

The paintings will be on display daily 9-4:30 p.m. in the Kirk's undercroft, Dr. DeWindt announced.
