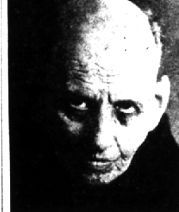

Local Artist Creates Figure For 77-Foot Catholic Shrine

The largest crucifix in the world was completed recently when a massive bronze figure of Christ created by Marshall Fredericks, 875 Wadlington, Bloomfield Village, was hoisted into position on a mammoth redwood cross.

The shrine, located at Burt Lake in Cheboygan county, 25 miles south of the Mackinac bridge, towers 77 feet above ground level. The figure is 31 feet in length. It was cast in Norway and shipped to Michigan this summer to be positioned on the cross that was erected in 1954.

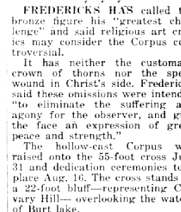
Ex-Correspondent To Open Lecture Series Net Week
