

**1958's Accidents Kill 91,000 People**

More than 40 times as many U.S. residents died in accidents last year as were killed in the great Chicago fire, the San Francisco earthquake and the Titanic sinking combined.

The national safety council, in a recently published statistical yearbook, reports 91,000 Americans died in 1958 accidents—37,000 in auto accidents alone.

The combined death toll in the three famous disasters was 2,169.

Research conducted by the Ohio Department of Health reveals that an individual's birthplace may be a factor in his developing cancer.
